Dean Hosts Nassau for NFC Lead

The two teams with perfect Northeast Football Conference records meet Saturday when Nassau CC travels to Franklin, Mass., to meet Dean College. The matchup also features the most recent league champions in Nassau (2010) and Dean (2007, 2008 and 2009). The Bulldogs have won their past five games while Nassau has won its last four.

The league's other two games will be in the state of New York as ASA travels to Erie and Louisburg is at Hudson Valley. Lackawanna plays the Tiffin JV in a non-conference contest.

PLAYERS of THE WEEK: On offense, a familiar face returns as Louisburg's Rasheed Williams takes the honor for the fourth time this season. Williams, a 6-foot-1, 200-pound freshman running back from Swedesboro, N.J./Kingsway H.S., ran for 263 yards and two touchdowns on 37 carries in Louisburg's win over Alfred State. He had a long run of 68 yards as he surpassed the 1,100-yard mark for the season.

On defense, Dean's Charmarcus Pittard, a 6-0, 225-pound freshman linebacker from Athens, Ga./Cedar Shoals H.S., was in on 14 tackles in the Bulldogs' win over Erie. Pittard had five solo tackles to go with nine assists. He also recorded three tackles for loss.

On special teams, Lackawanna punter Tony Krepich, a 5-foot-11, 190-pound freshman from Leesburg, Va./Hargrave H.S., had six punts for a 40.3 average in the Falcons' win over ASA. He had a long punt of 67 yards and placed two inside the ASA 20-yardline.

LAST WEEK: Dean's Andre Williams ran for 141 yards and two touchdowns to lead the Bulldogs to a 19-13 win over Erie.

Lackawanna's Davonta Farrell threw for two touchdowns in the game's final two minutes to lead the Falcons to a 27-20 victory over ASA.

Louisburg's Rasheed Williams ran for 263 yards and two touchdowns as the Hurricanes blanked Alfred State 23-0.

Nassau got 118 and 117 rushing yards from Seth Hill and Jamaal Jackson, respectively, in the Lions' 37-6 win over Globe Tech. Each ran for a touchdown while Leonard Dixon ran for two scores and 92 yards.

STAT WATCH: Louisburg's Williams ranks among the NJCAA's leading rushers and scorers. Williams averages over 178 yards rushing per game.

IT MUST BE THE NAME: Seven NFC players, three with the last name Williams, ran for 100-or-more yards this past week. Outside of Louisburg's

mark. Erie's J.J. Dickey, Lackawanna's Lorenzo Taliaferro, and Nassau's Seth Hill and Jamall Jackson also surpassed the 100-yard mark.

HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE?: Through 14 games, the home team has won eight times. Dean has recorded three of the six wins by the road team.

NEARING THE END: This week marks the final week of NFC play for Erie and Hudson Valley. From the opposite perspective, Louisburg, Nassau and ASA each have three games left when including Saturday's games.

MUST LIKE NEW YORK: Louisburg makes its second trip to the state of New York in as many weeks with the Hurricanes' game at Hudson Valley. The Hurricanes will make a third trip in two weeks to play ASA.

RANKINGS: The Northeast Football Conference featured Nassau at 16th in the Oct. 11 poll. Dean received votes for the second-straight edition.
